Reports of Officers

City Manager Thaipejr stated that at a prior meeting, he reported that watering of the orange grove between Redlands Boulevard and Mission Road would be discontinued due to budgetary constraints; that a few rows of orange trees near Heritage Park would be preserved and put on a drip system; that the remaining grove would eventually die and be removed. This past week, J. J. Ramirez Grove Maintenance expressed a willingness to maintain 40 acres of the 60 acre grove by diverting run off water from an adjacent grove at no cost to the City, which would prolong the life of the grove about three years.
